#### USEFUL SUGGESTIONS FOR PRIESTS COMING TO ROME THE PONTIFICAL NORTH AMERICAN COLLEGE

- 1) Obtain transcripts of grades and courses from all seminaries and universities attended. (It is helpful to include a description of each course).
- 2) Obtain about twenty-five (25) passport size photos these are needed for visas, library cards, identification cards, etc.
- 3) (a) If traveling by ship, allow ample time for baggage to arrive at point of embarkation. Address it to yourself care of North American College, Vatican City, Europe. If baggage is shipped unaccompanied, address it to North American College, Uffici Merci, Vatican City, Europe. DO NOT USE ROME or ITALY in the address or you will get involved with Italian customs. Air freight, preferably with TWA, is an efficient way to ship personal effects.
- (b) The Seminary Department of the North American College group flight Alitalia AZ 611 is departing New York at 6:30 P.M. on August 31. This flight is scheduled to arrive in Rome on September 1. There is no special ticket discount for those over 25 years of age. However, there are special baggage arrangements being made to bring personal effects to Rome via air freight, at a comparatively low price. There will also be bus transfer from the airport to the Seminary Department and the Graduate House for those who wish to use this flight. If you are interested in this flight, please let me know as quickly as possible in order that Alitalia representatives can contact you in the United States.
- (c) Group flights may possibly be arranged for the fall session of the Institute for Continuing Theological Education that is held at the Casa Santa Maria. This flight would depart on an airline and flight to be announced at a later date. It would depart New York September 19, arriving in Rome September 20. This may be a convenient flight for some people, and anyone interested in this possibility could advise the Superior of the Casa Santa Maria at the earliest convenient time.
- 4) It would be helpful for incoming priests to acquaint themselves with the fundamentals of the Italian language, especially vocabulary, before coming to Rome. We suggest that you arrive on SEPTEMBER 1, in order to participate in a program of Italian literature and language, if you are not familiar with the language. The following are the language programs available to those who wish to take advantage of this opportunity:

- (b) The Canonesses of St. Augustine operate a language school that opens on September 15. Modern laboratory equipment, up-to-date teaching techniques and a certain amount of personal attention can be provided. Financial arrangements can be made on an hourly basis at a reasonable rate. Please ADVISE US if you wish to participate in this basic program that lasts about five weeks.
- (c) A special course at the Italian University for Foreigners in Perugia, is available from September 4 to 29. Application for this program should be made directly to:

The catalog lists the possibilities for accommodation during the period of the Language Institute. This is an exceptional opportunity, and some seminarians and priests prefer to take an extended program during the summer. This could provide an introductory course for those unfamiliar with the basics of Italian.

- (d) Arrangements can be made here in Rome for a private tutor. This is generally more expensive.
- (e) There are other programs available at Berlitz, the London School, etc., here in Rome.
- Most everyday needs may be obtained in Rome. However, if you prefer particular brands, they may not be available or may be expensive.
- 6) Italian customs may levy duty on typewriters unless actually carried in hand or sent with belongings to Vatican City. Olivetti typewriters of excellent quality are available at reasonable cost in Rome.
- 8) Cigarettes may be purchased at the Casa. The price is comparable to that in the States. American pipe tobacco and cigars are not available in Italy. Customs allows a small quantity of these items to be brought into the country. Such items being mailed from the States should be sent only to the Vatican address and not more than one box of cigars or pound of tobacco should be sent each month.
- 9) Electrical equipment: electric current in the Casa runs about 120-135 AC at 50 cycles (U.S. has 60 cycles). Americanmade typewriters, radios, etc., will generally run off this current. Electric razors may need a special transformer.
- 10) Roman weather is changeable. The fall and winter can be chilly and rainy. Sweaters, raincoat, umbrella, rubbers, top coat are advisable. Comfortable shoes for walking are a must.
  - 11) Clerical dress is expected in Rome. The black suit and rabat are acceptable attire.
- 12) Books are available from many sources in Rome. Those books published in the U.S.A. are generally more costly than they would be if purchased in the States. Judge your needs accordingly. You should bring with you the basic texts and books that will be useful to you in your major area of concentration. The Seminary Division of the North American College operates a bookstore. They offer reasonable discounts for Casa residents.
- 13) Opportunity for recreation is ample. The facilities of the Seminary Department of the College are available to the Casa residents (tennis, handball, bowling, baseball). Sporting equipment is expensive and difficult to obtain, e.g. tennis shoes.
- 14) Money: Personal checks can be cashed at a small agency near the Casa, at American Express, Cook's Travel Agency, or at the Istituto per Opere di Religione at Vatican City. It is advisable to have a checking account in the States at your local bank. Make prior arrangements to have your money deposited there.
- 15) Blue Cross or similar hospitalization plans usually extend coverage to European hospitals. This should be checked before departure. Make certain that you have basic coverage.
- 16) No visa is required for entrance into Italy by American citizens. You will be required to apply for residence papers upon arrival at the Casa.
- 17] The universities begin their academic programs in mid-October. THE CASA SANTA MARIA IS OPEN ON SEPTEMBER 1st. Try to arrive at least by about October 1st.
  - 18) An international driver's license is very useful see AAA.
- 19) If you arrive by air, there is airport bus service from the airport to the central air terminal in Rome. Cabs are expensive. If you do take a cab, settle the price beforehand. This should never exceed 6000 lire, or about \$10.00.
- 20) If you plan to travel in Moslem countries or behind the Iron Curtain, it would be helpful to have your passport photo taken without Roman collar.
  - 21) Please Inform the Superior of the Casa when and how you will arrive.

Your Eminence:

Now that things have settled down and taken definite shape, I want to tell you about the program I have been able to work out for myself.

I spent the first several days inquiring about programs. I speke to the dean of the faculty at the Gregorian University, Fr. Beyer, and to the Sec'y Gen. of the Lateran, Msgr. Biffi. I also sopke to as many of the American Students as I could find from each University, to find out what actually was being taught in the classrooms.

I discovered right away that there was no way an accredited University in Rome could give me a Licentiate in only one year. The requirements for this degree, of course, are not their own but those of the appropriate Congregation. There was no way that the Lateran, even, could allow me credit for tork already done during my work for the STL at Mundelein. Msgr. Biffi was very definite on this point.

I then went about seriously comparing the courses offered by these two universities. I came to the conclusion that, contrary to what I had expected, the course at the Gregorian University would be much more useful to me in the work I expect to be doing for the Archdiocese at the Tribunal.

Both faculties contained about as many men in curial positions of one kind of another. On the other hand, the course descriptions in the catalogues and the observations of the older men here at the house from both schools suggested that the Gregorian was much more concerned with the shape of the law in the future than the Lateran. Certainly both schools teach the present code, at it is the law in force. Yet the Gregorian promised to go a step beyond by making us aware of the work of the revision comission, and the directions of their discussions, so that when we should encounter the 'new' law in the future, we will already be somewhat familiar with it. The relevant Vatican documents figure prominently in the catalogue of the Gregorian University, as well.

With this information as a background, I gelt that the direction being taken by the faculty at the Gregorian would be more practical and beneficial for me. I therefore registered at the Gregorian University as a regular fulltime student in their Canon Law program. I must say that, right from the first, their classes have taken the directions they promised. The professors do not bond themselves to a canon by canon treatment, but are looking behind the present law to something more permanent, and therefore of more use to the student.

The main treatise this year is De Sacramentis, and we will of course concentrate on Marriage. We will also have short courses on some of the other sections of the code. The courses on De Personis and De Processibus will be the main matter next year, again with some amaller matters.

Through one of the professors at the Gregorian, I was offered an opportunity to work for a couple of months at the Congregation of the Sacraments. I began this week, and will be there three days each week until the work is completed. A group of us, under the direction of a Msgr Ragni, are doing a statistical survey of RMC cases from 1962, analyzing the kinds of people involved in these marriages, and the length of time required to process the crase. It is interesting to see the work of the Congregation from their end, and I don't think the time involved will interferre with my studies.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for the interest you have shown, and for the investment you have m made in my work. I have tried to keep this foremost in mind in lining up my program of studdes. I hope that my studies here in Rome will enable me to be of the most service to yourself and the people of Chicago. I would feel it a compliment to receive any comments you might have to make on my program, or on any matter in which I might be of service while here.

Dear Cardinal Cody:

I hope that by now how have recovered from the fatigue of your rond-the-world trip. I know that you were given very little time to rest while you were here in Rome. I had hoped to have the opportunity to discuss my program with you a little bit, but that was clearly impossible. I thought that I would do so in this letter.

The first semester exams are long gone now, sucessfully completed. Havarette is good in his insight as to what makes a good case presentation. I am finding it very helpful.

The first phase of the study of RNC cases has been completed. The number codes are now being transferred from the work sheets to IRM sheets for use in optical scanning equipment that is at the Vatican. It will be some time before that stage of the project is finished. It seems that they do not plan to publish the material; it was uncertain whether it would be communicated privately to the Ordinaries or not. I suppose you know more about it than I.

I expect that our exams in June will be completed before the fifteenth of the month. I have argeed to assist the formation department of NAC in a project they have in conjunction with the US Army Chaplain's Office. There is a retreat program during July for high-school and jr. high-school dependants, in Berchtesgaden. So I expect to be there from July & until August 4.

I will be free from then until classes resume Oct 15, and Tagr. Hahowald strongly prefers that we vacate the house duging August for maintainence purposes. So, if it is all right with you, I would like very much to return to the city during the remainder of August and part of September. I would be eager to assist at a parish for week-end help, and perhaps Father Dolciamore could put he to work somehow at the Tribunal. What A would hope to have time to do, besides visiting with my friends, would be to do some re-

I have received your interesting letter of October 30, 1973, and I am pleased to know that you are safely settled again in Rome. I am happy, too, to learn that you were able to get some good work done on your thesis while you were at the seminary.

We have had no official word about the appointment of Monsignor Ben Farrell to assume direction from the Audience Office, but I suppose that this will come in due time. I am pleased to learn that Father Bagley will be the Assistant Chancellor to my classmate, Bishop Flanagan of Worcester. Incidentally, I was one of his co-consecrators in Burlington, Vermont.

Mr. Ryan has given me your letter of October 30, 1973, and I have deposited a check in the amount of \$436.00 (cf. attached deposit slip) to your account as of this date.

With better transmittal of The New World, you will be able to keep up on the latest news.

I have had four funerals this week, two of them boys who were burned to death at Angel Guardian Home; today Monsignor Kelly's funeral, and I am now leaving to preside at the funeral of the third boy, a non-Catholic, at the Home. This whole thing was a tragedy, a youthful prank that fired back on the four boys who were in the room sniffing paint thinner. One either lit a cigarette or dropped a match in the can of paint thinner. There was a terrific explosion and two of the boys were actually burned to death; another ran out of the room in flames. He was 99% burned so it is a merciful blessing that the Lord took him to Himself. He is an Indian boy, not a Catholic. The fourth boy is badly burned internally and his lungs may possibly be scorched. He is still alive but it is doubtful whether he will survive.

He did look like the man who is 77 years old and still works rather hard. His leg seemed to be bothering him slightly, but not too much, at least on Easter.

I am locking forward with some eagerness to finding out what assignment will be given me for a residence. Perhaps that is because it will be only the second parish assignment I have had since being ordained nine years ago. I think Fr. Keating knows me well enough, but naturally I would be happy to correspond with him if he wishes.



Joseph Cardinal Bernardin has named Rev. Robert C. Becker as Officialis (Chief Judge) for the Archdiocese of Chicago succeeding the Very Rev. John V. Dolciamore. Father Becker will head the Metropolitan Tribunal which chiefly adjudicates requests for declarations of nullity of marriage.

Cardinal Bernardin also re-appointed Rev. Leonard A. Bogdan as Vice-Officialis and named a judge of the tribunal, Rev. Thomas A. Tivy, as a second Vice-Officialis.

Robert Becker. According to Victim I's statement, Victim I came to know Fr. Becker through Fr. Ruge. In October 1983 Fr. Becker arranged to take Victim I to a resort at Woodhaven Lakes RV Park near Sublette, Illinois. Fr. Becker asked Victim I to complete a multiple choice questionnaire that was sexual in nature, including questions about masturbation. During the trip Fr. Becker also exposed himself, masturbated Victim I and attempted anal sex with him. Abuse of a similar nature occurred during other trips with Fr. Becker to Woodhaven, on an out of state trip, and during an overnight stay at St. Clements rectory between approximately 1983 and 1986 when Victim I was in approximately eighth to tenth grade. Victim I reports going to Woodhaven with Fr. Becker seven to eight times per year, often with other boys. Fr. Ruge would also accompany them on these trips on occasion, including to Woodhaven and out of state. During these trips, Fr. Becker and/or Fr. Ruge would ask the boys to sleep in their beds with them, or would find opportunities to have to share beds. Victim I also alleges abuse by Fr. Ruge.

This abstract replaces the summary prepared by Kathleen Leggdas, Professional Fitness Review Administrator for the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office of Professional Fitness Review, of Victim AQ's statement, given to Ms. Leggdas on November 12, 1999, formalizing his allegation of sexual abuse against Fr. Robert Becker. According to Victim AQ's statement, he came to know Fr. Becker through Fr. Ruge at St. Leonard, who was a friend of the family, in the sixth and seventh grade. According to Victim AQ the two priests owned a trailer in Woodhaven RV Park. Fr. Becker and Fr. Ruge took Victim AQ and other boys on weekend trips to Woodhaven Lakes. Victim AQ reported that on these trips, Fr. Becker slept naked beside Victim AQ, fondled his genitals, masturbated him and forced Victim AQ to fondle Becker's genitals. Victim AQ had initially contacted the Archdiocese regarding his abuse by Fr. Becker in 1992, after his family was questioned by the State's Attorney's Office.

1. Bill Kennealley came in just for his periodic report on how things are going. He said that basically it is a matter of maintenance. He doesn't really have much contact with Bob in the rectory.

- 2. One of Bill's concerns is that when he talked to Tom Ventura about taking Bob, there was no discussion at all of the length of time that Bob would be there. Bill thinks now that that might have been a mistake. It would probably be better if a term had been established. Bob has been there about two years now. The only thing that was pretty definite was that there was no expectation of Bob to do any parish work. It would be very difficult for Bill to sit down with Bob now to try to negotiate a term. He doubts if Bob would even want to sit down.
- 3. Bill does not want to over-state the problem. This is not a high priority situation with him. But it is a little awkward and Bill just wonders how long will Bob remain there.
- 4. Bill used the word "languishing" to describe Bob's situation. He has no involvement in the parish whatever. He has very little outside interests. He reads mystery stories, plays with his computer and is in his room most of the time. He is very preoccupied with his health. Basically, Bob seems to be incapacitated. He is not of any real help at the parish and Bill wonders if this is good for Bob for the diocese to keep him in this kind of situation. It also seems as though Bob is going to the Tribunal less and less. There just seems to be a general weariness about him.
- 5. It's also awkward with regard to the parishioners. Bob seems to cast a pall over everything. Bill gave an example of how on Sunday morning three or four parishioners were with him in the kitchen having a good time, laughing and joking, etc. Bob walked in and there was immediate silence. It was very awkward, as not even Bill knew just what to say. Then Bob went on and the joking and laughing resumed. It just seems as though no one quite knows how to deal with it.

There have been no young boys in the rectory and Bob has had no contact with anyone.

7. I told Bill that I would do the best I could to check with Bob to see how long he plans to be at St. Gertrude's, what is happening at the Tribunal and the possibility of him teaching at the seminary, etc. But I did not give Bill much hope that I would succeed in clarifying the situation. I told Bill that it is bewildering for all of us and I just appreciated very much his willingness to be kind and offer Bob gracious shelter.

1. Bill Kenneally, the pastor of St. Gertrude, met with me today just to give a progress report on Bob Becker's presence in the rectory. Bill wasn't quite sure what his role was as the on-sight supervisor, but he thought he ought to touch base with me.

#### 2. With regard to Bob's personality.

But it just seems as though Bob is in a world all of his own. He is quite concerned about his health and seems to lack any joy. This makes him a bit unattractive to live with. Bob is not involved in the parish at all. As an example, Bill mentioned that a parishioner who was "Mr. Pillar of the Church" had died and Bill just mentioned it to Bob and Bob had no idea at all who he was.

- 3. With regard to his work habits, Bill doesn't think he goes to the Tribunal very often. Actually, Bill doesn't know how many days Bob is supposed to go but he notices that Bob is around the house late in the morning quite frequently. Bill is not sure it's a good idea for Bob to be in a parish with no parish involvement. He says Mass on Sunday and his homilies can sometimes be quite long and sad and a sort of "veil of tears" approach. Bob doesn't get much positive feed-back on his homilies. He also says Mass once or twice during the week.
- 4. On a positive note, the secretary at the rectory said the other day that she thought that Bob "seemed to be a little more pleasant". I mentioned to Bill that that was my reaction also the last time I met with Bob. I know what Bill is talking about as far as the sadness in Bob is concerned, because that has been my impression most of the time. It just seems as though he is kind of listless and preoccupied and there is no sparkle in his eyes or face. But the last time he did seem a little more relaxed and I even mentioned it to Bob.
- 5. Bill said he thought that the notion of Bob's being at St. Gertrude's was that it be a transition place for him but not that he remain there for a long time. Bob mentioned that he would like to teach Canon Law at Mundelein. But he never said whether he has pursued this. Bill is not trying to get rid of Bob. At present, he is just neutral on his presence. Bob doesn't add anything to the place and I tried to explain to Bill that for all practical purposes he and the people of St. Gertrude are providing Bob with a safe haven while he concentrates on his recovery. I gave Bill an idea of the numbers of meetings Bob has to attend and as a result he really doesn't have much time for anything else.

I hope you received the copy of my memo to Cardinal Bernardin concerning my visit on August 25. Again, I wish to thank you for your warm welcome and gracious hospitality on the occasion. Now I would like to provide some additional information in preparation

- 1. I have arranged with John Flavin for you to stay at our rectory (St. Sebastian) that week.
- 2. I contacted Ed McLaughlin about your involvement in the Monday afternoon priests' group. I believe he phoned you about this. Ed was enthusiastic about your participation.

3.

- 4. Concerning your assignment after you return to Chicago, I discussed the matter with the Cardinal. Here are his ideas:
  - A) He doesn't think that it would be wise to appoint you to the faculty of the Seminary as a Professor of Canon Law. However, he is open to your teaching a course there on a part-time basis if that were agreeable with Jerry Kicanas and the Mundelein faculty.
  - B) He agrees with you that you should not continue as Officialis or Vice-Officiales of the Matrimonial Tribunal.
  - C) He would like you to work as a canon lawyer on the staff of the Tribunal. This would be your official assignment.

5. Concerning a place of residence, I have looked into that matter and have a couple of possible parishes under consideration. I hope that these will be more definite soon. I would like to have more clarity about this before October 12.

I hope that covers all the bases, or at least enough of them to provide an overview of how things are shaping up on this end. As you know better than any of us, this is a complicated matter. On the one hand, we are all trying to be realistic and practical in all of these decisions. On the other hand we want you to know clearly that you are loved, respected and valued back here in Chicago.

When I read your letter of February 17, 2005, I was very moved by the anguish that you described. It has taken a few weeks for some of the information that you requested to be obtained.

You have asked about Robert Becker and Kenneth Ruge, both deceased priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago. It has been determined by the Professional Responsibility Review Board of the Archdiocese of Chicago that both Robert Becker and Kenneth Ruge engaged in sexual abuse of minors.

In response to your request for help, I have given a copy of your letter to Ms. Leah McCluskey, Professional Responsibility Administrator of the Archdiocese of Chicago. Ms. McCluskey works in the Office of Professional Responsibility where all matters of the sexual abuse of minors by clerics are forwarded. Please expect a contact from Ms. McCluskey in the near future. Ms. McCluskey will be able to share with you information on her office as well as the Office of Assistance Ministry. In this way, we may begin to assist you in this tragic matter.

You have asked some very good questions about motivation, responsibility, supervision and prevention. As to motivation, those who use minors for sexual gratification are sinners who are also suffering from a dangerous mental disturbance. As to the responsibility, we have tried to apologize to all those who are suffering because of the failure on the part of some bishops to supervise priests adequately. Through more vigilant supervision, more rigorous evaluation and more accurate education, we are making several efforts to address the problem. It is national policy to bar from public ministry and access to minors any bishop, priest or deacon against whom an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor has been found credible.





Robert Becker. The alleged abuse consisted of one incident of fondling while Victim CM was sleeping, which occurred during an overnight trip at a trailer shared by Rev. Becker and Rev. Kenneth Ruge. The alleged abuse occurred in the spring of 1976 when Victim CM was approximately 13 years old. According to Victim CM's statement, he later spoke with another boy who was on the overnight trip with him and told him about how Fr. Becker abused him; in turn, the other boy indicated that he was abused by Fr. Ruge in a similar manner on the same trip.

This abstract replaces the summary prepared by Patricia Zacharias, Professional Responsibility Assistant Administrator for the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office of Professional Responsibility, of Victim K's statement, given to Ms. Zacharias on July 11, 2008, formalizing his allegation of abuse against Rev.
